ISRAEL, GAZA, OUR RESPONSE

THE DEVASTATING TERRORIST ATTACKS OF OCTOBER 7, 2023, THE WAR, AND RISE OF ANTISEMITISM MADE THIS THE MOST DIFFICULT AND CONSEQUENTIAL YEAR IN RECENT JEWISH HISTORY.

Over the many months to follow, we have anguished over the safety of the hostages and security of Israel's future – and we have wrestled with the escalating humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

Our strategic plan calls for the JCCSF “to help people engage with and better understand both the beauty and complexity of Israel.” The tragic events of October 7 and the ensuing war centered our efforts on community and educational offerings.

We hosted experts on Israel, the Middle East and antisemitism to untangle the intricacies of this distressing moment. Partnerships with Jewish nonprofits expanded to deepen connections and scale impact. Our chaplaincy work broadened to address a surging need among our community members and JCCSF staff.

Yossi Klein Halevi from the Shalom Hartman Institute, along with award-winning podcaster Krista Tippett, provided insightful analysis on the situation in Israel.



Dr. Yehuda Kurtzer, President of the Shalom Hartman Institute, examined the impacts of the Israel-Hamas war on North American Jewish life.



More than 400 people joined our **Community Shabbat Dinner**, finding support in one another and comfort in our traditions.



Sheryl Sandberg and author Noah Feldman discussed the transformation of Judaism in Israel and its consequences over the last century.



600 people gathered to honor, remember and learn at our **Yom HaShoah commemoration**, presented in partnership with the JFCS Holocaust Center.

Young adults in their 20s and 30s joined facilitated “listening circles” to share diverse perspectives on the war and explore their Jewish identity.

More than 40 college students facing antisemitism and anti-Israel sentiment on campus attended a workshop we hosted with Hillel and the Israeli Consulate.

Brandeis University’s Chaplaincy Innovation Lab Grant funded our expanded spiritual guidance work. Our rabbi facilitated personal coping responses to a collective trauma through meditations, counseling and workshops.

CHARTING OUR COURSE

WE'RE TURNING OUR STRATEGIC GOALS INTO REALITY

As the JCCSF emerged from the pandemic, we discovered a silver lining: the recovery process provided a unique opportunity for us to reimagine and redefine our role within the local Jewish ecosystem.

We asked over 500 community and lay leaders questions like:

HOW DO WE BEST SERVE AN EVOLVING COMMUNITY?

HOW DO WE FORGE MORE PARTNERSHIPS TO RUN RESONANT PROGRAMS?

HOW DO WE CULTIVATE A DEEPER SENSE OF BELONGING?

HOW CAN WE ADAPT ADVANCED PROGRAM PLANNING TO RESPOND QUICKLY TO UNFOLDING EVENTS AND COMMUNITY NEEDS?

These discussions led to the collaborative development of a **5-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN**, adopted in 2023, that is guiding us toward our future.

WE ARE A BRIGHT LIGHT FOR MODERN, DIVERSE JEWISH LIFE



Last year gave new meaning to modern, diverse Jewish life – and the JCCSF’s role in fostering it. More offerings brought together thousands of community members – both participants and partners – to share joy, find meaning and embrace new opportunities.

Our First Night Passover Seder lifted 220 community members with ritual, song and stories.

Residents with developmental disabilities at the Jewish Family and Children’s Services’ Shupin House and their families gathered for an art-filled Passover. They created Seder plates and enjoyed sharing a meal together.

Our first deliciously festive Mimouna Passover Celebration with JIMENA (Jews Indigenous to the Middle East and North Africa) was one of many programs that embraced and showcased the diversity of Jewish life.

With spring came Purimpalooza! Partnering with Congregation Emanu-El, we welcomed over 650 new faces and Purim characters of all kinds into our space.

Our 60+ cohort celebrated Rosh Hashanah, Hanukkah, Sukkot and Passover with holiday lunches, learnings, live performances and friendship.

We helped our seniors access the city with 379 free taxi rides to see a doctor, pick up medication, shop for groceries or workout at the JCCSF.

The JCCSF supported mission-aligned community organizations with \$70,000 worth of subsidized onsite rental space.

WE ARE GROWING VIBRANCY

The past year was all about connection – to Jewish values, Jewish life and each other. From spirited preschoolers to lifelong learners and fitness enthusiasts, 4,000 people of all ages and life stages walked through the doors of the JCCSF every day. The JCCSF doubled down as a central hub for San Francisco’s Jewish community.

ARTS & IDEAS We nourished the soul of our community – and city – with a full menu of food, music, film, theater and art.

Nourish Your Roots, an exhibition co-curated with ArtSpan, featured over 40 works. 14 Bay Area artists took inspiration from the Jewish holiday of Tu Bishvat and teachings of renewal.

PRESCHOOL Over 300 little ones at the JCCSF's three preschools explored new interests, found best buddies and discovered the magic of play! 60 students received financial assistance, totaling over \$650,000.

TIKVAH SCHOOL OF MUSIC & DANCE Russian and Ukrainian children tapped into their heritage, embraced self-expression and explored Jewish culture through music, dance, art and Shabbat celebrations.

SWIM SCHOOL Last year, we taught thousands of kids to swim by providing over 1,250 swim lessons every week.

YOUTH SPORTS Tots to 11-year-olds learned the fundamentals of basketball, baseball, soccer and volleyball, and had a blast! 650 budding basketball players showed up for winter hoops alone.

SUMMER CAMP 813 campers jumped into immersive experiences that built self-confidence, cultivated friendships and seeded lifelong Jewish journeys. We distributed \$88,000 in financial assistance among 57 children in need.

FITNESS Our community got fit. Over 1,100 people worked out every day at the JCCSF - in classes or on their own, from cardio to aquatics and everything in between.

WE ARE CONTRIBUTING TO THE CULTURAL FABRIC OF SAN FRANCISCO

THE JCCSF PLAYED A LARGER ROLE IN SERVING OUR CITY OVER THE PAST YEAR, EXTENDING OUR REACH ACROSS DIVERSE COMMUNITIES, AFFILIATIONS AND ZIP CODES.

We deepened connections inside and outside our building with celebrations and commemorations – equal parts joyful and soulful – all envisioned through a Jewish lens.

Our Hanukkah pop-up at Ghirardelli Square, hosted in partnership with local artists, culinary professionals and Jewish organizations, was a welcome celebration of light. A turnout of over 800 people transformed Ghirardelli Square into a communal Jewish space.



Earlier in the year at the Ferry Building, our Sukkot pop-up made the beauty of this holiday accessible to every San Franciscan with art, food, stories and ritual.



We created Erev Juneteenth, an innovative new program commemorating Juneteenth with a nod to Jewish tradition. Chef Michael Twitty worked his culinary magic for 70+ guests while Ilana Kaufman, Jews of Color Initiative CEO, facilitated thoughtful conversation.

We kept busy during Pride Month. The JCCSF worked with JCRC, Keshet and two dozen synagogues and community partners to form the **largest ever coalition of Jewish organizations** to participate in the city's Pride Parade. Over 300 people joined us!

In partnership with Value Culture, we recognized Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month and Jewish Heritage Month with a Soy Vey Shabbat, honored Black and Women's History Months and, along with the Jewish Film Institute, produced a Soul Vey Havdalah to celebrate Black and Jewish cultures. Each gathering was an example of what goes right when we bring intercultural communities together.



EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES

Over the past year, our collaborations with civic partners brought more kids and youth opportunities into the fold.

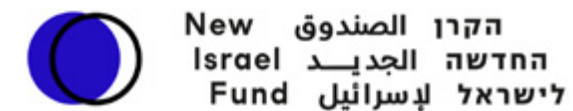
The Department of Children, Youth and Their Families (DCYF) renewed a \$1.5 million grant (over 5 years) to sustain JCCSF Citywide, a program that last year provided instruction in art, dance and sports to 1,444 young students attending historically underserved public schools in San Francisco.

Our partnership with Children's Council, one of San Francisco's leading children's advocacy organizations, bridged the financial gap for 17 children to attend summer camp at the JCCSF.

Five teenagers from across San Francisco interned at JCCSF summer camp thanks to our collaboration with Mayor London Breed's San Francisco's Summer Together Initiative, aka Mayor's Youth Employment and Education Program (MYEEP), which fosters the well-being of San Francisco's youth.
